

# Finalists Chosen for the 6<sup>th</sup> Annual ULI Dallas-Fort Worth Impact Awards

DALLAS, TX – **For immediate release**. The finalists for the 2021 ULI Dallas-Fort Worth Impact Awards program have been selected by a jury comprised of members of the Urban Land Institute from across the North American continent. The continued popularity of this Awards program was demonstrated yet again this year, by both the quantity and quality of Impact Award applications submitted, despite the unique circumstances of 2020. In total, ULIDFW received applications for 32 remarkable developments from all over the Metroplex. Ranging from downtown Fort Worth and Arlington to The Colony, McKinney and Frisco, and back to the Dallas CBD, these projects are a testament to the robust CRE industry of this region, giving our jury members a considerable challenge when narrowing down the submissions to these well-deserved finalists.

This marks the sixth year for the Impact Awards, an event that has become a significant draw for the region's leading developers, investors, architects, contractors and designers. The Impact Awards Gala will be highlighted by the awarding of the prestigious "Vision Award" to Steve Van Amburgh. Previous Vision Award honorees include H. Ross Perot and Ross Perot, Jr., in 2015, the legacy of Trammell and Margaret Crow in 2016, Herb Weitzman in 2017, Roger Staubach in 2018, and Craig Hall in 2019.

Although the Impact Awards jury members typically take part in a 2 day in-person tour of the competing developments, this year's jury members adapted to a virtual model, meeting together via Zoom video conferences. Over the course of two intensive meetings, they reviewed each of the submissions utilizing the submitted images, Google Maps and StreetView, as well as local context provided by ULI members. "This year's jury was focused on the ULI mission of creating and sustaining thriving communities. They quickly identified which developments were having a significant positive impact on their surroundings," noted Pam Stein, Executive Director of ULI Dallas-Fort Worth. "With several outstanding projects submitted by non-profits, they also determined that the Social Impact category first implemented in 2019 should be continued, creating a fifth award again his year."
